Each year, The Royal Canadian Legion sponsors a nation-wide contest on the theme of Remembrance in the categories of poem, essay, black and white poster and colour poster using Canadian symbols. Cash prizes are awarded.

Support from the schools in our communities is critical to the success of this Contest, and even more importantly, in fostering the tradition of Remembrance in our youth. We want to see strong participation of students from all schools, not just from a few. Many schools have not had any student entries in the past years. Schools often have great participation from the student population in preparing for their own Remembrance ceremony. Schools don't need to have entire classes submit, but rather individual students can enter. This is where we ask for your school support in reaching your talented students. Please help us in making this year successful! Entry deadlines to our branch is **December 1**st **2020**.


This year Canada marked the 75th Anniversary of the end of WW2. Our branch is extremely proud to have submitted entries that were chosen as national winners in colour and poem categories. You will find a bronze tablet located at the base of the flags beside the Lethbridge Cenotaph of the National poem.

Original work must be submitted, and a legible entry form attached to it (facing out) using clear tape and no staples. It is suggested that students make a record a copy of their entry.

Find enclosed are materials, rules and entry forms. There are a many free resources available including the Legion <u>teachers guide</u> for download. You staff will find this a wonderful resource for your Remembrance Day Committee as well. We would also like to bring to your attention of the <u>Lethbridge Military Museum</u> as another resource or for school visits. POSTER CONTEST

Colour or Black & White

Remembrance

Contestants are challenged to exercise their creativity and submit a poster on the theme of Remembrance in either colour or black and white.

This is a contest to select the most suitable posters submitted by students in the Canadian school system.



The posters will be judged at the local Branch and then at the Provincial level. The Provincial winners in the Primary, Junior, Intermediate and Senior categories will then be submitted to Ottawa for judging at the National level.

A plaque will be awarded to the 1^{st} place winner in each category, and to the 1^{st} place winners' schools.

Prizes will be awarded on the recommendation of the judges, whose decision will be final.

On notification of having been selected as a winner at the Dominion Command level, the artist or writer agrees to the full and exclusive non-profit use of the art or literary work by The Royal Canadian Legion for the period of one year, after which all rights for usage revert to the artist or writer.

Regulations

- 1. All entries to be submitted to the local Legion branch.
- **2.** Entries will be no larger than 56 cm x 71 cm.
- All entries will be hand drawn/painted in one of the two categories: Full colour Black and White
- **4.** Entries will be judged on originality, expression of designated subject drawing and illustration. COMPUTER GENERATED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 5. The poster shall reflect **REMEMBRANCE** with a Canadian theme. If symbols are used, Canadian symbols such as Canadian and provincial flags, coats of arms, and representative flowers, birds or animals, as well as all forms of Canadian historical and current military dress shall be pre-eminent.
- **6.** Contestants may enter both a Colour and a Black and White Poster, but may submit only one entry for each.

- 8. National 1st place posters will be displayed at the Canadian War Museum in Ottawa for one year. 2nd and 3rd place national winners will be displayed at Parliament Hill during Remembrance week. All artwork will be returned to the artists through Provincial Commands.
- **9.** Students who have been out of the educational system for more than two consecutive years are ineligible to compete in the Poster Contest at any level.

LITERARY CONTEST

Essays and Poems

Remembrance

Contestants are challenged to exercise their creativity and write an essay and/ or poem on the theme of Remembrance.

This is a contest to select the most suitable essays and poems submitted by students in the Canadian school system.



The essays and poems will be judged at the local Legion Branch and then at the Provincial level. The Provincial winners in the Junior, Intermediate and Senior categories will then be submitted to Ottawa for judging at the National level.

A plaque will be awarded to the 1^{st} place winner in each category, and to the 1^{st} place winners' schools.

Prizes will be awarded on the recommendation of the judges, whose decision will be final.

On notification of having been selected as a winner at the Dominion Command level, the writer agrees to the full and exclusive non-profit use of the literary work by The Royal Canadian Legion for the period of one year, after which all rights for usage revert to the writer.

Regulations

- 1. All entries to be submitted to the local Legion branch.
- 2. This contest is open to all students in the Canadian school system.
- 3. Entries may be submitted in either English or French.
- **4.** Entries will be marked on the basis of originality of thought, expression, presentation, grammar, spelling and Canadian content.
- Candidates must complete an official Registration Form, available from the local Legion branch or on line at legion.ca/contests, and attach it to their entry (no staples please).
- **6.** Candidates will use only one side of the page.
- 7. Entries **must** not exceed the word or line limit.
- 8. Contestants may submit an Essay and a Poem, but may submit only one entry for each category.

- 10. Students who have been out of the educational system for more than two consecutive years are ineligible to compete in the Literary Contest at any level.



POSTER CONTEST REGULATIONS

- This contest is open to all students in the Canadian school system.
- 2. All entries are to be submitted to the local Legion branch.
- Students who have been out of the educational system for more than two consecutive years are ineligible to compete in the Poster Contest at any level.
- 4. Entries will be no larger than 56 cm x 71 cm.
- Please choose which contest you would like to enter and use only the following:

Colour: Full colour

Black & White: Pencil, charcoal and/or India ink

- Entries will be judged on originality, expression of designated subject, drawing and illustration.
 COMPUTER GENERATED ENTRIES WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 7. The poster shall reflect REMEMBRANCE with a Canadian theme. If symbols are used, Canadian symbols shall be pre-eminent. Such national symbols are Canadian and provincial flags, coats of arms, and representative flowers, birds or animals, as well as all forms of Canadian historical and current military dress.
- Candidates will complete an official Registration Form, available from the local Legion branch or online at www.Legion.ca. Attach it to the entry (no staples please).
- 9. Winning posters, at the national level, will be framed and placed on display at the Canadian War Museum in Ottawa for one year. Second and third place national level winners will be displayed at Parliament Hill during the week of Remembrance. All artwork will be returned to the artists through Provincial Commands.
- 10. A Contestant may enter both the Colour Contest and the Black and White Contest, but may submit only one entry for each category.

- 4. Entries may be submitted in either English or French.
- Entries will be marked on the basis of originality of thought, expression, presentation, grammar, spelling and Canadian content.
- Candidates will complete an official Registration Form, available from the local Legion branch or online at www.Legion.ca. Attach it to the entry.
- 7. Candidates will use only one side of the page.
- 8. Entries must not exceed the word or line limit as outlined on the entry form.
- A Contestant may submit both an Essay and a Poem but may submit only one entry for each category.

Original Thought 40%	Is the material fresh? Does it have a sincere ring? Does it reflect a student's view?		
Effectiveness of Presentation 30%	Is the material presented dramatically? Does it sustain interest? Does it make a point? Is it too long? No more than 800 words for Senior Essay, 500 words for Intermediate Essay or 350 words for Junior Essay.		
Clarity of Language 15%	Is the language simple, direct? Is it expressed logically?		
Composition 15%	Are the basic rules of syntax observed? Are the basic rules of punctuation followed? Is the spelling correct?		

NB: Judges at any level are not to change/alter any text on the submission.

Effect 15%	Does the author succeed in maintaining any special effects? (i.e. staccato rhythm, explosive phrases or imagery)					
Clarity 15%	Is the message clear?					
Pace 15%	Is the pace consistent? Is it dull?					
Rhythm 15%	Is the rhythm of words appropriate? Is it natural? Is it exciting?
