 - Bible Curriculum PowerPoint shared how this is being transformed (ATTACH FILE)
 - CFRR narrative integrating Bible and reading scripture IN class.
 - Purpose of Bible Curriculum Support Staff deep hope, learning continuum grade 6-12, can fit any teacher/teaching style, increase Biblical literacy, promote questions and conversations
 - Staff deep hope: Authentic Faith, Pursue Understanding (what practice support authentic faith?)
 - Continuum Grade 6 to 12: read through the entire Bible, addition of Bible 10, connect to creationfall-resurrection-redemption story arch through entire Bible curriculum, existing resources (CSI –

Christian Schools International: Walking with God and His People), existing classes (Religious Meanings (11)/Sociology (12))

- Biblical Literacy: Best practice to teach BIBILE is to actually read the Bible. Components: Home reading, in-class reading. Goal: read through the Bible form grade6-12, inductive, read it for what it says, not what we want it to say (Romans 10:17)
- Essential Questions for each grade. Asking the essential question (grade based) every today with the passages and writing what they are thinking about.

- PREFACE – We all understand Mental Health is a huge concern. Concern: Signal Hill Curriculum being used to supplement the health curriculum. (Lesson Plans available for sensitive topics such as Suicide, Self Harm, Depression)

- Community Helpers came in to speak to the class (Lethbridge Family Services (LFS); John Thompson was willing to share with parents what was shown, and taught.

- ASK: When bringing in 3rd party teachers/presenters - PLEASE give parents the opportunity see content presented and give parents the option to permit/exempt a child from participating PRIOR to such presentations.

- MATT – lots of conversations happen ahead of time with the presenter, the school counsellor and admin AND a teacher is always present. LFS is a very common group to bring in to talk to the students. Agreed that we can do a better job of communicating about what is upcoming as they do not want to undermine parents. Students DO need an education on these topics and growth in language around these.

- Using PowerSchool (Carrie) wondering how parents are using PowerSchool and if there are
 insights or requests stemming from their experiences with various teachers not all students have
 phones / are accessing PowerSchool what other means of communication are teachers using to
 share this data.
 - Request to not just use it as a live grade book but for teachers to add assignments/quizzes/tests into PowerSchool at least a few days ahead of a due date. This is a great tool to help students (and parents) plan and schedule studying and homework time, especially when other non-academic commitments are also vying for time each day.
- IDEA Do a live demonstration of PowerSchool and how it can be used.
